

# HOW DOES MEDICATION FOR ADHD WORK?

Which children benefit from taking ADHD medication?

What cognitive and behavioral difficulties are improved?

How do these improvements happen?

What dose of medication results in the greatest improvements?

A new research study at the University at Buffalo is seeking to answer these questions and more.

The Center for Children & Families at UB is looking for children between the ages of 9 and 12 to participate in a weeklong medication study. The study will take place in a summer camp setting during July to August.

## CAMP ACTIVITIES:

- Computer based research tasks
- Free time and planned game/crafts time
- Classroom periods
- Breakfast and lunch are provided



**Camp is free; there are no fees for participation or for medication.** You must be willing for your child with ADHD to be both on and off medication during the camp.



**BENEFITS AND COMPENSATION:** Children will earn prizes each day of the study for participating and parents will receive a small compensation. Parents also receive a week's worth of daytime supervision for your child, and an assessment of your child's ADHD symptoms and performance on IQ and achievement tests.
